Growing Representation in Social Work Scholarship

Bethel has created the Growing Representation in Social Work Scholarship to encourage underrepresented populations in the social work profession.

Two recipients will be selected for this competitive \$5,000 scholarship for the 2024-2025 academic year. The scholarship is not renewable, but students may reapply for the scholarship in subsequent years. If selected for a scholarship, the funds will be evenly split between fall, spring and summer semesters.

Recipients must:

1. Be a current student pursuing the Master of Social Work degree **or** admitted to begin the Master of Social Work degree program for Fall of 2024.
2. Complete the scholarship application and submit it to Bethel's Social Work Department by the deadline of April 15, 2024.
3. Enroll at least half time (3 credits per semester in courses required for the student's program of study).
4. Maintain [Satisfactory Academic Progress](#).

Eligibility Requirements: Recipients do not need to demonstrate need, and are not eligible for other Bethel-funded grants or scholarships. Students already receiving gift assistance from any source (including military benefits) that fully meets tuition are not eligible for this scholarship.
