- Attend on-campus athletic events to see your Royals in action.
- Attend Kingdom Culture events and visit the Cultural Connection Center.
- Utilize Bethel's counseling services—they're free to undergraduate students!
- Visit the Office of Accessibility Resources and Services if you need support, like exam accommodations, a sign-language interpreter, or textbooks in alternate formats.

- Apply to be on Welcome Week staff or a Shift leader so you can pave the way for future Bethel students.

- Get involved with Bethel Student Government. These students get to make decisions that impact the Bethel community.
- Join a community group that meets weekly to continue developing your faith.
- Explore the Academic Enrichment and Support Center, a free resource that offers tutoring, exam prep, writing support, and study skills workshops.

- Explore Bethel's study abroad options.

- Start networking with alumni in your planned career field.
- Become a teacher's assistant (TA) for a professor in a course you enjoy.

- Land an internship or part-time job that will give you professional experience.
