MINNESOTA STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES* ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN

CENTURY COLLEGE (CC) AND BETHEL UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF ADULT & PROFESSIONAL STUDIES (CAPS)

*The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities is authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 136F to enter into Agreements and has delegated this authority to colleges and universities.

This Agreement is entered into between Century College (hereinafter sending institution), and Bethel University College of Adult & Professional Studies (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

The sending institution has established an **Associate in Science degree in Nursing** (hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a **Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing** (hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. Students must fulfill the graduation requirements at both institutions.
- C. Students must complete the entire sending program and meet the receiving institution's admission requirements for the agreement to apply.

Transfer of Credits

- A. The receiving institution will accept 75 credits from the sending program. A total of 47 credits respectively remain to complete the receiving program of 122 credits.
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table.

Implementation and Review

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure, and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. This Articulation Agreement is effective on 09/01/2014 and shall remain in effect until the end date of 08/31/2019 or for five years, whichever occurs first, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning 03/01/2019 (within six months of the end date).
- E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of their intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.

Describe program admission requirements (if any)	General admission to a MANE collaborating college or university. Submission of official transcripts from all institutions attended. A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.75 based on the first semester of the MANE curriculum plan. Official transcripts will be used to calculate GPA. The most recent course grade will be used for the GPA calculation, whether it is higher or lower than previous grades. Each course of the MANE curriculum plan must have been achieved with a letter grade of C or better. Identification of previous enrollment in a nursing program. Full acceptance to the MANE collaborating college and university is dependent on successful completion of the second semester of the MANE curriculum plan, maintaining a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.75, including criteria in numbers 3 and 4 above. All applicants are required to complete the most current Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI), standardized Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) prior to application deadlines. Applicants are allowed two (2) attempts at the TEAS exam with a minimum of 4 weeks between attempts. The best score achieved, of two attempts, may be submitted. Advanced standing applicants, Licensed practical Nurses (LPN) must maintain unencumbered licensure from any state in the United States. Advanced standing applicants, Paramedics must be certified as a Nationally Registered Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic (NREMT-P), and/or state certified as an EMT-P (certification may be in any state in the United States, but must be to a level equivalent to a nationally registered EMT-P). Applicants must demonstrate English language proficiency via examination if (1) English is not their native language; and (2) the applicants have lived in the US fewer than 8 years at the time of applicants have lived in the US fewer than 8 years at the time of application to the program.
