OUR HISTORY

The Marley Community Church is a very special place of worship, unique because of its heritage of 190 years of service in a rural community. It was first organized as the O'Plain Baptist Church on October 5, 1833 in a pioneer settlement located approximately thirty miles southwest of the then small town of Chicago which had formed less than two months earlier. It was the first church of its denomination to be organized in Northern Illinois.

The church is also unique in its adaptability, once serving in a rural area which has now become a suburban community. This is largely because of the ability of its members to face the changes necessary for its survival and their ability to adjust to those changes. The church has moved twice from its humble beginnings in a log cabin and currently worships in a beautiful structure built in 1900 in the peaceful community of Marley. The building has been expanded and upgraded several times throughout the years.

The church has adapted to constitutional revisions and five name changes including Marley Baptist Community Church. It was the only church in the community at the time and was dependent on the people within that community for survival. The decision was made to remove the constitutional barrier which only allowed baptism by immersion in order to accept the dedicated workers in the church who would otherwise have been excluded from membership because of their mode of baptism. The current name, Marley Community Church, reflects our desire to welcome people of various denominational backgrounds to join in Christian worship.

A brief history of this sort cannot capture the heart and soul of the people who for the love of their Lord sought a place of worship for themselves and others. It cannot tell all the stories of loss and pain or of triumph and joy. The congregation that we are is the evidence that the living Spirit of God has dwelt among us. The prairie that families came to tame and farm is largely gone now. In its place is a new frontier; thousands of homes and families, presenting many challenges. As each generation at Marley Community Church has tried to faithfully meet the needs of its community, so now, we are challenged and commissioned to create opportunities to share the Good News and become a credible presence of Jesus Christ in the world.




















Current Practices

Marley Community Church regularly observes the Lord's Supper on the first Sunday of every month. All Christian believers are invited to participate. The church practices both believer's baptism and infant baptism. The church also practices a service of infant dedication whereby the parents may bring their children before the congregation to dedicate them to God. Our church facilitates weddings, funerals, and memorial services for our church family.

Church membership is awarded to those who: confess faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, give evidence of living an acceptable Christian life, and are in substantial agreement with the faith and practices held by our church. Marley Community Church is affiliated with the American Baptist Church of the Great Rivers Region.







OUR PHILOSOPHY

Faith is more than what happens on Sunday mornings. It's part of who we are, inside and out. At Marley Community Church, we believe in sharing the joy of the gospel daily and living a life that embodies the spirit of Christ.



Currently we offer the following:

- Weekly 10:00 Sunday Worship Service, which includes traditional hymns as well as praise music led by our praise team. Video screens are utilized during the service.(average attendance: 50)
- Sunday School for adults before the worship service
- Childcare during worship service
- Kids Club on Wednesday evenings during the school year
- Youth Group on Wednesday evenings (Kids Club and Youth Group average attendance: 30)
- Quest church camp for our youth
- Bi-Weekly Men's breakfast at a local restaurant
- Sunday night men's group
- Monthly Women's breakfast
- Bible studies
- Fellowship coffee hour after the worship service every Sunday
- Daytime luncheons and pot luck dinners at various times
- Annual Flea Market
- Annual HeART in the Park
- A beautiful park which offers a pavilion, Caleb's Corner playground, picnic tables, and "The Little Library"




























CONGREGATIONAL STYLE

In our desire to welcome people of various denominational backgrounds, our active congregation includes many different ages, income levels, and careers.

Leadership	Our church has a shared leadership model with collaboration between the congregation and the pastor.
History & Tradition	Marley Community Church is grounded by our history and traditions, but we also strive to be adaptable.
Social Issues	Our church's approach to social issues is Biblical and orthodox leaving any action to individual conscience. We have not been faced with some of the current social issues and will look to our new pastor to help us navigate these challenges as they present.
American Baptist Churches (ABC)	Our church is affiliated with ABC. We benefit from their advice and guidance and utilize their resources. We contribute to the three main ABC mission offerings. Being affiliated with ABC is not a requirement for our pastor.
Community Involvement	Our church participates in several community activities and also strives to assist those in need in various ways, including supporting Morning Star Mission and contributing to local food pantries.
Church Structure	Several boards and teams share responsibility for our church organization, and the church is ultimately governed by the congregation. The pastor gives overall guidance for the vision of the ministry. A church constitution provides formal guidelines.

Operating Budget

Our Operating Budget for 2024 is approximately \$160,000. This includes all operational expenses including pastoral, custodial, and secretarial services.



Pastoral Qualification & Compensation

Marley Community Church is looking for a full-time pastor with a bachelor's degree or above who is an ordained minister or plans to be ordained within two years. Included in this Profile are the responsibilities and strengths we are looking for in a potential candidate.

We at Marley Community Church believe strongly in providing our pastor with a compensation package that is generous, customized to the needs of the candidate and reflects good stewardship of the regular offerings from our church attendees. Aspects such as MMBB enrollment (401K, disability, and life insurance), housing allowance, and salary will all be considered in the total compensation package.

Our entry level total compensation package (which includes MMBB enrollment, housing allowance, salary, and any other option agreed upon by the candidate and the church) will start at \$65,000. Medical insurance and vacation time will also be negotiated. The candidate's experience, education, oratory skills, and intangible qualities will determine the final agreed upon total compensation package.

Missions

The support for missions outside of the church is deeply embedded in our DNA. In 2023, the total given to missions was over \$57,900, or approximately 25% of the total church offerings. The recipients of these mission dollars vary from year to year and are first vetted by a leadership team for their appropriateness.

Organizations receiving funds include:

Morning Star Mission homeless shelter,
Samaritan's Purse, Under His Wings home for
women, Northern Baptist Theological Seminary,
Quest Youth Camp, missionaries Robin &
Heather Allen, and Trinity Services for the
developmentally disabled. We also contribute to
three ABC offerings: America for Christ, One
Great Hour of Sharing, and World Mission
Offering.





The congregation supports several local organizations such as community food pantries through donated items that are not reflected in the financials. In addition, the church is engaged in several 'hands-on' activities.

Members of our congregation have partnered with the Feed My Starving Children organization to

contribute to both the funds and volunteer hours needed to locally pack food to send overseas. The number of meals packed at our community mobile packing event over the past several years is approaching two million.

Another significant accomplishment was the creation of a 12-bed assisted living facility adjacent to the church property. Marley Oaks Assisted Living Residence opened its doors in 2005 and has served well over a hundred seniors from the community. It is a not-for-profit, self-sustained, Christian entity. Interaction between the church volunteers and these residents is a blessing to all.



OUR BELIEFS
