The Discipleship Pastor plays a vital role in advancing the church's mission: to be followers of Jesus who go and make disciples through the power of the Holy Spirit. This leader will be responsible for overseeing the spiritual development, discipleship, and pastoral care of the adult members of the congregation. This role will focus on building a community where adults can grow in their faith, encounter Jesus, and serve with others in the church and in the broader community. They will inspire others to abide in Jesus, be transformed by Him, and live on mission with Him.

The Discipleship Pastor will work closely with the staff, volunteers and congregation members to foster an atmosphere of spiritual growth and engagement. Using the discipleship pathway, they will engage and equip adults to become passionate followers of Jesus, cultivating practices necessary to grow as disciples who make disciples, and to live on mission in impactful ways.

As a staff member, the Pastor will prioritize their relationship with God so that they are abiding in Jesus, becoming more like Him and living on mission with Him. The Pastor will show up in the ways defined in the Team Covenant.

Annual ministry plans will outline the current initiatives, goals and metrics that will engage, equip and activate the adults in the congregation to take their next step. These ministry plans will be submitted annually, goals measured, and ministries evaluated 2-3 times a year, including an annual review. This job description and the annual ministry plans are used to outline responsibilities for staff members.
